ABILA Executive Committee Meeting

The Executive Committee of ABILA met during International Law Weekend. Three new members were elected to the Executive Committee: Professor Joel Trachtman (Hon. Secretary 1995-1998); Professor Leila Sadat Wexler (Chair of the Committee on the International Criminal Court); and Mark Zaid, Esq. (Program Chair for International Law Weekend in 1997 and 1998).

It was also agreed to raise the annual dues of Institutional Members to \$80 from the previous \$70 in light of ILA Headquarters charging us £50 per Institutional Member.

A motion to authorize the election of a "President-Elect" was referred to a drafting committee. Meantime, on the motion of the President, it was agreed that the President should send to the existing Vice-Presidents copies of all his outgoing e-mails relating to the ABILA.

Dues

The time has come for payment of membership dues for 1999. The Executive Committee affirmed that dues must be paid by 30 April 1999 for 1999 calendar year membership. Reminders and a formal application form are being sent separately to all 1997 and 1998 members of ABILA, but payment of dues is always welcome. Please be sure that your name and address are included with your payment. The ABILA is a tax exempt 501(c)(3) organization and no goods or services are provided to members in return for their dues.

News of Members

Professor Ved Nanda, long a member of the ABILA Executive Committee and Director of the International Legal Studies Program at the University of Denver College of Law, was named to an endowed professorship on 26 October 1998. The University of Denver considers the new chair "as a tribute to his immense contribution to promoting world peace and respect for human rights." Ved is Vice Provost for Internationalization at the University of Denver.

International Law Association Executive Council Meeting

The Executive Council of the International Law Association met in London on 21 November 1998. The time and place for the next biennial Conference of the Association was fixed for the last week in July of the year 2000 in London. The Conference for 2002 will be held at Easter time in New Delhi, India; Berlin, Germany, will be host to the meeting in 2004.

A Study Group on the Law of State Responsibility was formed. The American Branch member will be Professor David Caron of Boalt Hall.

Several new ILA Committees were proposed, but no action was taken to give them official sanction. The proposals include committees on electronic contacts, international insolvency, biotechnology; humanitarian law and the international criminal court; organized crime; intellectual property; the evolving UN Charter; the Law of the Sea; and international law in national courts (focusing on the problems raised by the Breard case -- the Paraguayan executed for murder in the United States despite the failure of the prosecuting authorities to notify the Paraguayan Consul of his arrest, as apparently required by the 1963 Vienna Convention on Consular Relations; Paraguay's complaint to the International Court of Justice has recently been dropped, but the issue of co-ordinating the international obligations of the United States with our federal/state system have been with us for two hundred years and persist).

ILA Committee Membership Policy

Under rules adopted formally at Taipei, Chairs of ILA committees are empowered to nominate up to three persons to membership in their committees regardless of Branch affiliation. Each such nomination needs the approval of the Director of Studies. This procedure does not limit the existing authority of each Branch to nominate members to places in ILA committees subject to the approval of the chair of the committee, but provides the chairs with an additional source of expertise in case more than one, two or three members of any particular branch has expertise believed important to the work of the ILA committee. Nor does the new procedure limit the existing arrangement whereby chairs and reporters' positions can be filled by the Director of Studies without regard to Branch memberships.

Branches with more than 100 members may nominate two members to ILA Committees; branches with more than 250 members may nominate up to three. The American Branch currently has 258 members. All nominations are subject to the approval of the chairs of the respective committees and appointments to ILA committees are made by the ILA Executive Council at its semi-annual meetings.

Membership in international committees is based on individual reputation and achievement and does not represent any Branch orthodoxy. Nominations by the American Branch to international committees are normally reserved to members of the Branch who have achieved a reputation sufficient to support the nomination. Active work as reporter or chair of a Branch committee is frequently the most persuasive criterion to establish a reputation adequate to support nomination to an international committee.

Several international committees do not have American Branch members or alternates. The easiest way to be nominated to membership in an international committee is to serve as an organizer/chairman or reporter of an American Branch committee dealing with a related subject.

If there is no international committee currently dealing with a significant topic of sufficient interest, the easiest way to form one is to organize an American Branch committee on that topic, produce a report that can be circulated to our counterparts in the parent organization, and then propose an international committee. The successful proposer of an international committee is usually asked to be its organizer, chair or reporter. The process is not difficult.

There is constant turnover in membership of both American Branch and ILA committees. Those members of the Branch interested in participating more actively in the committee work of the organization at any level should contact the chairs of existing committees or the Branch's Director of Studies directly.

The new Chairman is Professor William Aceves, California Western School of Law. Our thanks to Professor Christopher Pyle, the outgoing Chairman, for the job just finished.

Similarly, the Committee on Maritime Neutra 'ty completed its work and was discharged. The Chairman, Professor George Walker, Wake Forest University Law School, will continue working in the ABILA Committee on the Law of the Sea.

A number of other ABILA committees have been relatively inactive for the past two years and their chairs are now vacant. Persons interested in subject matter that might come within the purview of any of those committees and with a plan for a reporter or other active work should contact the Director of Studies. In the absence of interest in continuing the work of those committees, they will be "sunsetted."

Branch committee chairs are always looking for reporters and members who want to be active. A current listing of Branch Committees and their chairs and reporters is appended to this Newsletter. Any member of the Branch wishing to organize a new Branch committee on any topic within the purview of the ILA should contact the Director of Studies proposing a topic, a reporter, and a plan for the recruitment of qualified members. The proposer may also take the chair and serve as reporter for a new committee if a membership of the committee that is large enough and diverse enough can be achieved.
