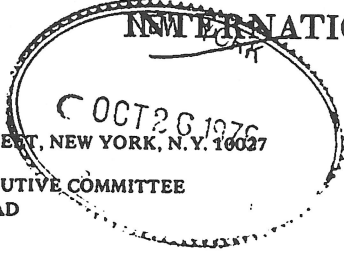

INTERNATIONAL LAW WEEK-END IN NEW YORK (Nov. 12-13).

THE MADRID CONFERENCE (Aug. 29-Sept. 4, 1976)

The Spanish Branch was a gracious host for the 57th International Law Association Conference. Twenty-five American Branch members attended with spouses in many cases. Proceedings will be published by the London headquarters to contain the reports on commercial arbitration, terrorism, human rights, undersea installations and surface installations other than ships, access to water resources, environmental protection, enforcement of parole and probation orders, international monetary law, traffic accidents, land-locked states. Reports submitted by American Branch Committees are printed in the Branch Proceedings, mailed to members in August, 1976. The social program included a trip to the Monastery of Escorial, a "bull fight" picnic, visits to museums, and a gustatorial treat at the traditional banquet.
